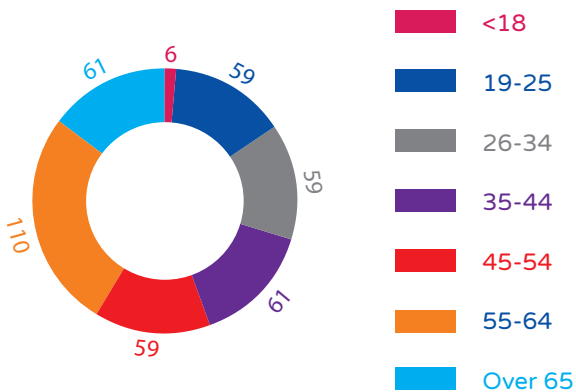

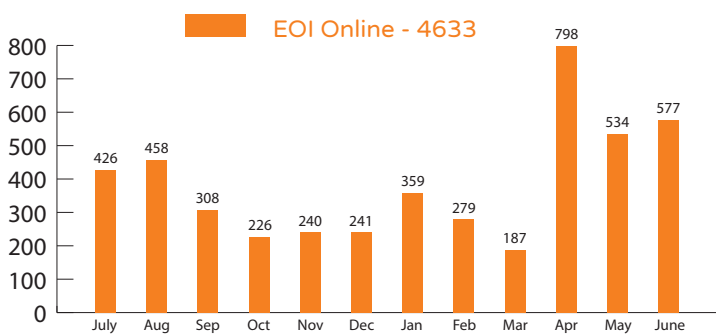

President's Report

President/Chair Report – Volunteering Geelong

Like most organisations when Volunteering Geelong started the 19/20 financial year we did so with sound strategic plans and a resolve to make the year the best yet for Volunteering Geelong Inc and the Volunteering Geelong Community Trust. We had invested and recruited in additional management resources for the organisation with the appointment of Jolanda De Jong and the Board had completed a detailed review of its future strategic directions.

In January 2020 we launched our renewed vision and held major workshops with our volunteers. We had also just received our largest ever philanthropic donation with a grant from Percy Baxter Trust to purchase a much needed people mover to transport volunteers and be available for hire by the Volunteer Networks within G21 region. We had board renewal with the departure of Jeff Cooke our beloved Colac based volunteer warrior being replaced by not one board member but two and welcomed Lloyd Gosling AM, KGSJ and Lily Stefanovic.

Then the corona virus global pandemic hit, our activities, viability and welfare of our volunteers was thrown into an unprecedented period of chaos. Initial confusion, frustration and lack of information was followed by social isolation and distancing restrictions which had the duplicity of increased demand for volunteers and health restriction which meant volunteers could not volunteer. During this period to continue Volunteering Geelong's operations we moved to work from home model and most volunteering activity was suspended.

Government financial support was received in the form of the JobKeeper package and small grants to implement covid-safe practices and policy. It is appropriate that I acknowledge the leadership of Helen and her team during the whole of 19/20 but in particular during the pandemic, with Helen's care, compassion and resilient leadership Volunteering Geelong would have struggled to be able to emerge out of the pandemic (when that does occur).

I wish to also acknowledge our volunteers during this unprecedented year, both those volunteers whom provide so much support to Volunteering Geelong activities and those outside of the organisation in the many volunteering roles within the G21 region. Our volunteers have never been more in demand or more restricted, and I thank you all for balancing your own health and safety and contributing with volunteering in Geelong. We have lost some volunteers, routines have been upended and social isolation has permanently changed some of our volunteer's lives, but I wish it to be recognised that even when not volunteering, during the pandemic many of our volunteers by staying safe were contributing to our community by making Geelong a safer place.

I wish to also acknowledge all my fellow board members ongoing support and publicly acknowledge Grant Hawkins for his support as Vice President, Ron Andrews leading our Strategic Review and ongoing implementation discussions and Sandy Bell for her financial guidance and administrative support to Helen and the team as Treasurer.

The future is not going to be easy for Volunteering in Geelong and Volunteering Geelong. The pandemic has dried up many business sponsorship and business grant opportunities for volunteering in our community. The federal Government has flagged a desire to reign in its massive deficit and this may result in further tightening of the already nimble allocation of funding to volunteering. The State Government is undertaking a major state-wide review of volunteering and we continue to receive no direct funding support from any of the local government authorities in the G21 region towards volunteering.

I am optimistic that our strong Board, dynamic management leadership, sound foundations with our home in the St Mary's Precinct, our Trusts Grant obtaining capabilities and our volunteers we will emerge from the global pandemic a better, healthy and leading part of the G21 community.

Volunteering Geelong Inc and Volunteering Geelong Community Foundation Trust

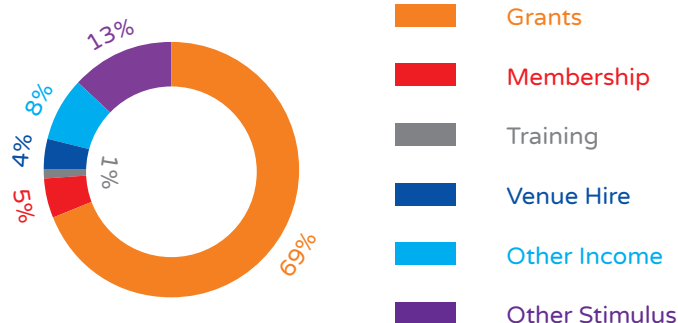
For the financial year ending 30th June 2020 Volunteering Geelong recorded combined revenue of \$256,127 and incurred costs of \$197,494, resulting in a surplus of \$58,406. This is mainly due to over \$50,000 in philanthropic grants awarded late in the year and \$32,000 in Government stimulus associated with the onset of COVID - 19.

Our main income source continues to be from the Federal Government through the Volunteer Management Program which continued at the current level. Memberships have shown good growth and but venue hire and training was curtailed due to COVID - 19 lockdowns.

CEO's Report

Economic Impact, COVID-19 Volunteering Geelong giving back to our community

As I write the 2019 -2020 CEO Report – we are in the middle of a pandemic forcing a lockdown and a stay at home directive to all Victorians.

Despite a pandemic, there are still people around willing to volunteer to help those who may be vulnerable or highly disadvantaged amongst our community. In March 2020 Volunteering Geelong auspiced the “LOCKDOWN BUDDIES” – the brain child of 2 Geelong Mum’s on maternity leave wanting to help the Geelong Community, Kara Statham & Rachel Bell.

With a \$500 support grant from Geelong Connected Communities Kara and Rachel, with some help by the Volunteering Geelong volunteers, harnessed the energy and enthusiasm of volunteers willing and able to help out anyone in isolation. They assisted with food relief, social telephone calls, shopping, assistance with appointments etc- all the while by staying safe themselves with contactless volunteering and ensuring the DHHS directives to sanitise and wear masks.

This pandemic has taken a toll on the community but did not rob the volunteering community of its enthusiasm to help where they could.

The Lockdown Buddies assisted in the delivery of over 100 APCO Foundation food relief parcels and continues to support individuals in our community who are experiencing social isolation.

So in finalising this report, I thank the impact of the VG volunteers; together we have conducted:

415 face-to-face or COVID Telephone interviews; an increase to the 2019 year with 172 additional interviews.

The Volunteering Geelong website enabled 4633 expressions of interest on line; 72,974 people engaged in our social media and community events halved.

As of 30 June 2020 we have registered 190 volunteer involving organisations (VIO) / community groups.

Volunteering Geelong with the 190 VIO’s created, updated and posted 300+ volunteer opportunities resulting in 7487 referrals.

Making a Difference Through Youth Mentoring

Making a Difference Through Youth Mentoring is a partnership project with Barwon Child, Youth & Family (BCYF) with funding from DHHS to support young people with a mentor to add positive change and experiences that make a difference to the young person's life.

Volunteers will be matched to a young person with similar interests who might never have had work experience, may be re-skilling to enter an alternate career path or may be unemployed and actively looking for work.

Impacting a Pathway to Employment Project
